E - Expected damage your car will do to other cars, lightposts, school fences etc.

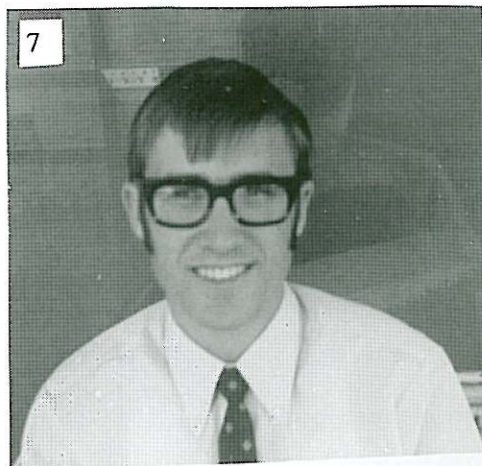
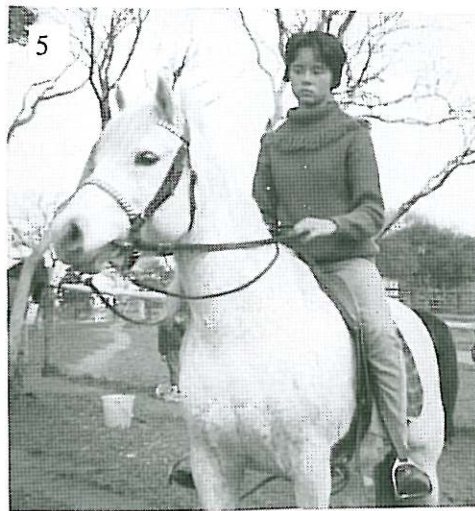
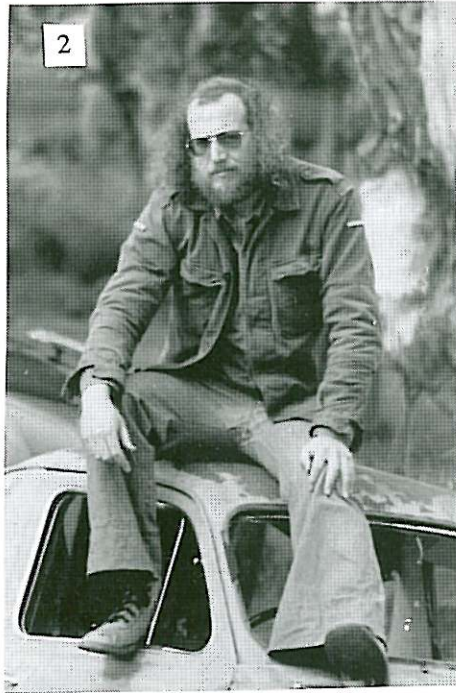
A - Total number of accidents you expect to have this year

Through the generations, most upheld the sacred laws and conditions, but there were always a few who suffered for their sins.

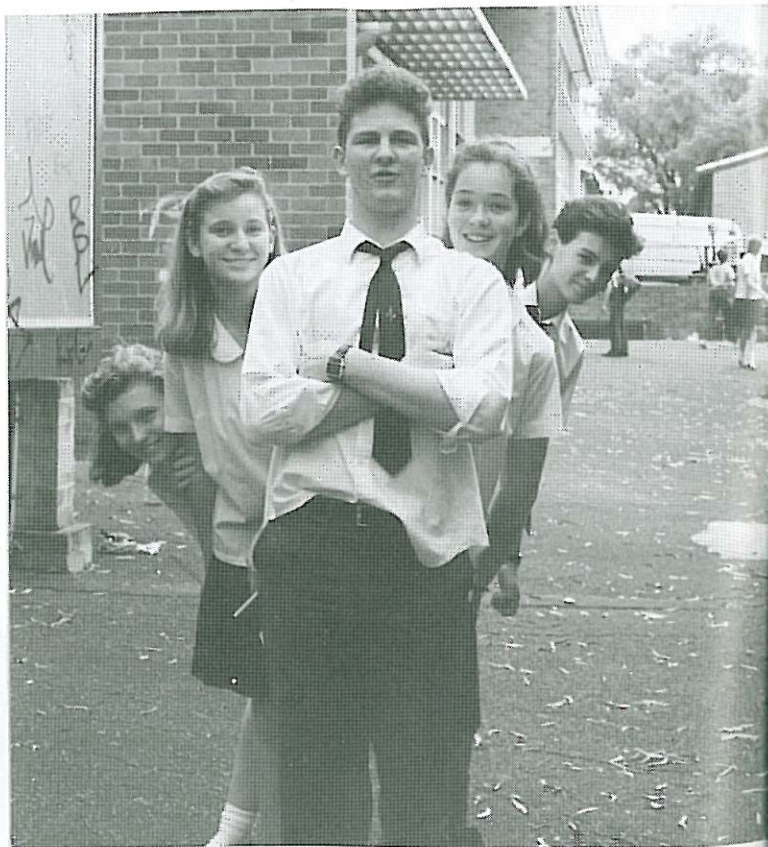
- He who was known as a Rod-Cross bum of a bloke

His mum, recognizing the new authority in Jack's voice, left him to it. Jack packed his suitcase, gave it to Gina and said "Take this, we're leaving."

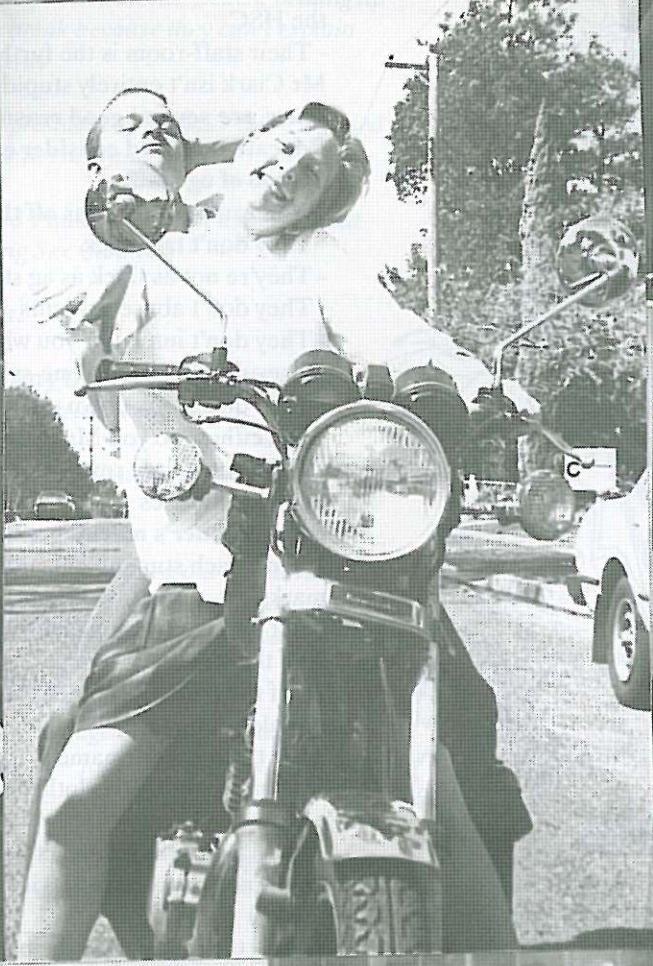
Gina meekly complied, and they were met by Jack's mother just as they were leaving. She asked "Where are you going, son?"

NATALIE AALDERS: *Will have dreamed her way into Days of Our Lives*

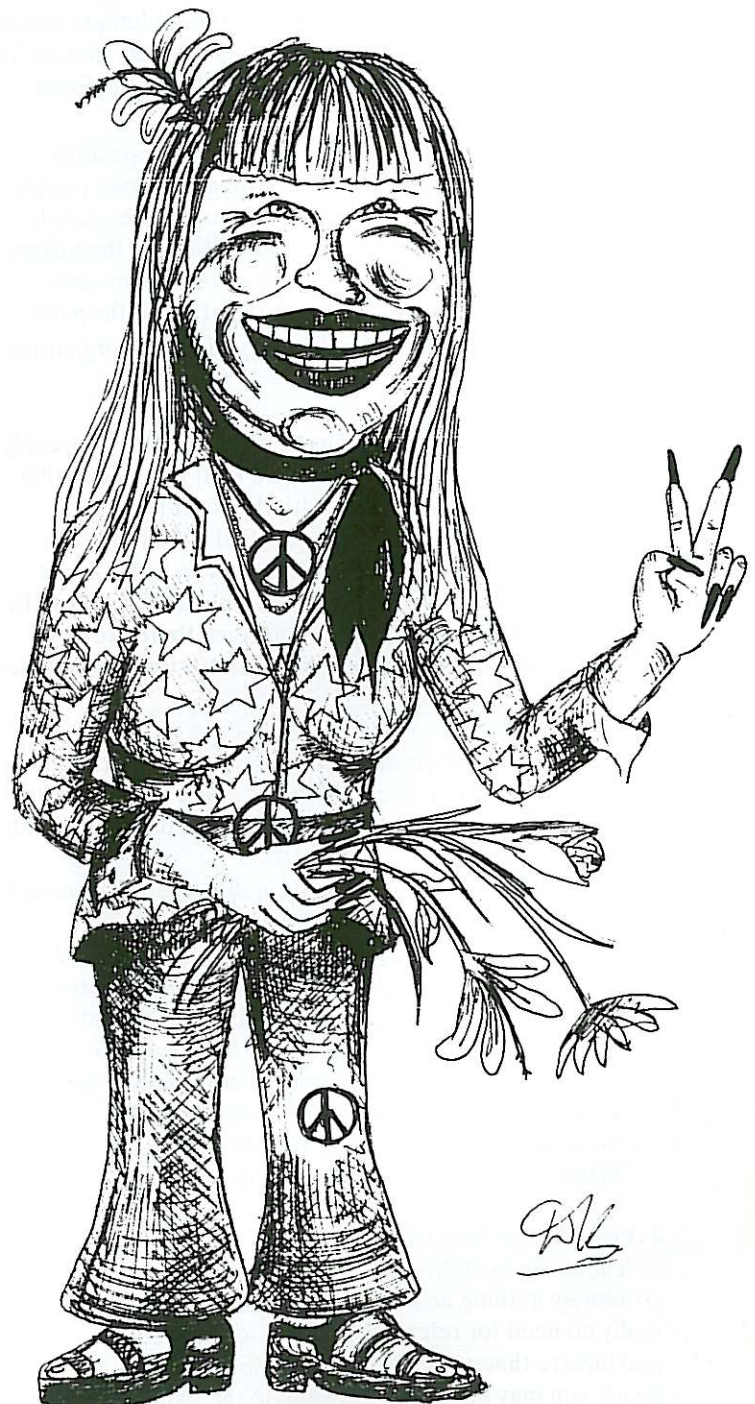

So when we look back at year twelve bio,

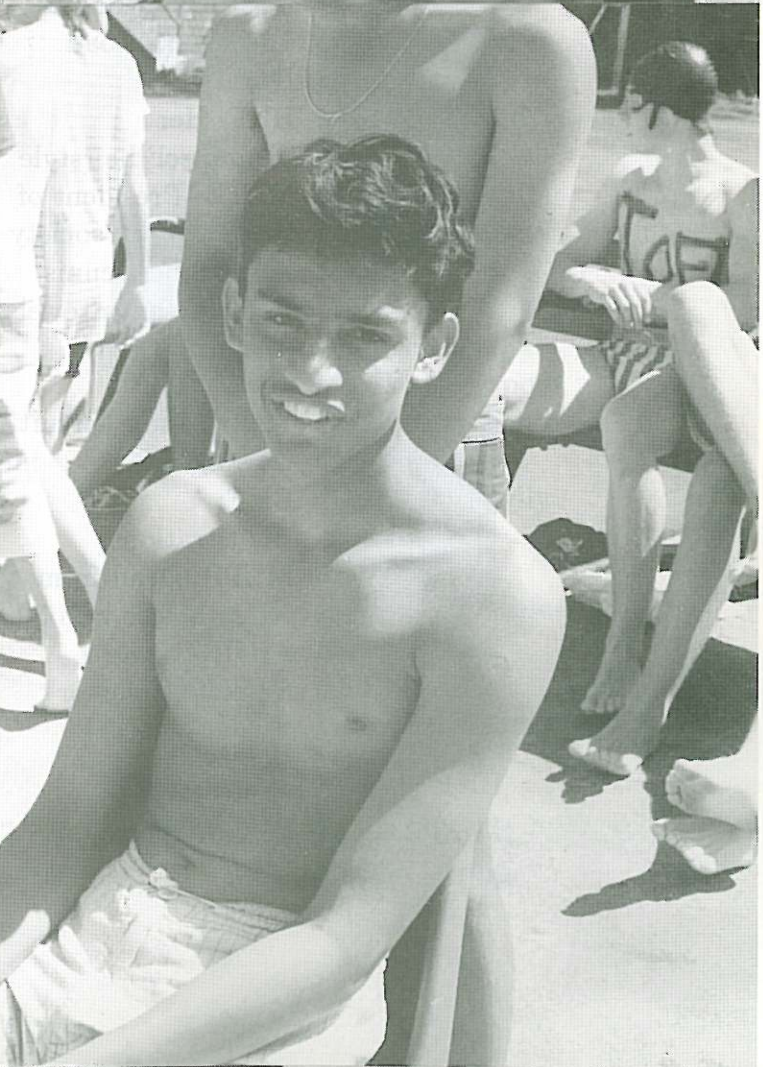
